

Dear Parent/Carer,

As we welcome children back at the start of a new academic term, we are committed to providing an environment that promotes the best possible opportunities for all our pupils and recognise this can be better achieved by supporting and encouraging good school attendance. It is vital if we are to ensure they succeed in school and in their future lives.

To ensure we act in line with current DFE Statutory Regulations, we would like to provide some further information and guidance on school attendance.

At Warren School, we recognise that there are occasions when it is appropriate to authorise an absence, such as when a pupil is too ill to attend school, has a medical appointment that cannot be taken outside of school hours or a request for leave has been agreed in exceptional circumstances. However, the Government does not support parents taking children out of school unless the school agrees this is appropriate under 'exceptional circumstances'. At Warren, we look at each request on its own merit, before reaching a decision. Any request for leave should be made in writing to the Academy Head, using the school's request form. The form should be returned to the office at least 15 school days before the start of the absence.

Not all requests for leave will be authorised. If the request for leave is not authorised and the parent/carer still withdraws the child from school, the absence will be recorded as unauthorised.

This does not mean there will automatically be a penalty notice.

The decision to submit a request for the issue of a Penalty Notice will be considered when a child's attendance is deemed to be 'not regular'. The definition of 'not regular' in this instance is when it is below the threshold. For all trust schools, this attendance threshold is set at 96%, in line with national attendance data. In the Autumn Term, a child's attendance for the previous academic year will be considered before deciding on a course of action. From January onwards, the decision will be based on attendance data from the current academic year.

In line with the Trust absence policy, if a child cannot attend school due to illness, we would expect a parent or carer to contact the school on the first day of absence on the main Warren School number: 01502 561893. If you do not contact us, we will phone you. This is known as First Day Calling. If we are unable to make contact we will send an email, text or send a letter requesting an explanation for absence. It is important to consider the vulnerability of some of our students to illnesses. Following a bout of sickness or diarrhoea, your child cannot return to school for 48 hours after the last bout.

You are welcome to contact the school if you feel you would like advice or support in helping your child attend more regularly. Warren School is committed to maximising the education of all its pupils and aims to work with parents to ensure this can be achieved. Only by attending school regularly, will children and young people be able to take full advantage of the opportunities available to them.
