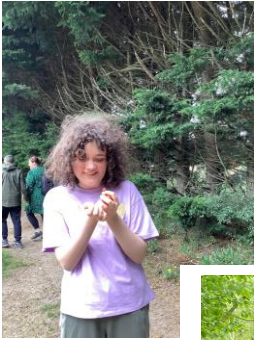
I can't wait to continue watching the children grow and thrive and I'm excited to see and be part of Warren School future.





## Post 16

Some pupils from Post 16 have been to visit the Goldcrest project as part of Involve Active. They were able to take part in walking an outdoor trail and planting different seeds to grow. Pupils looked at different materials to build a bug hotel and were able to try gooseberries and strawberries that had been grown there.



Pupils focussed when learning about D-Day and the 80th anniversary. They carried out artwork whilst listening to information, asking questions and thinking about our lives today compared to what happened then. Pupils liked listening to veterans speak which helped them to understand the time scale.



During the Childhood Day, pupils in Post 16 supported the running of the morning. They helped by leading other pupils as they walked and also helping with refreshments, taking money and serving drinks and biscuits. Prior to the event, pupils in the Post 16 made snacks ready for others to enjoy.



We have had a visit from the local police force as part of our careers programme. The two police officers spoke to pupils about opportunities that may be available to them in the future. They spoke about different roles within the police force, what is involved in their jobs and about training. Pupils enjoyed listening, asking questions, making a fingerprint keyring, and trying on the uniforms and visiting the police car.

Everyone moved a mile around the school field to raise money for the NSPCC and so far, have raise £84.47. There is still an opportunity to make donations via the QR Code below:



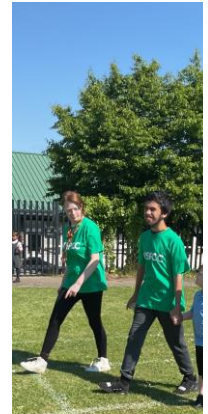
