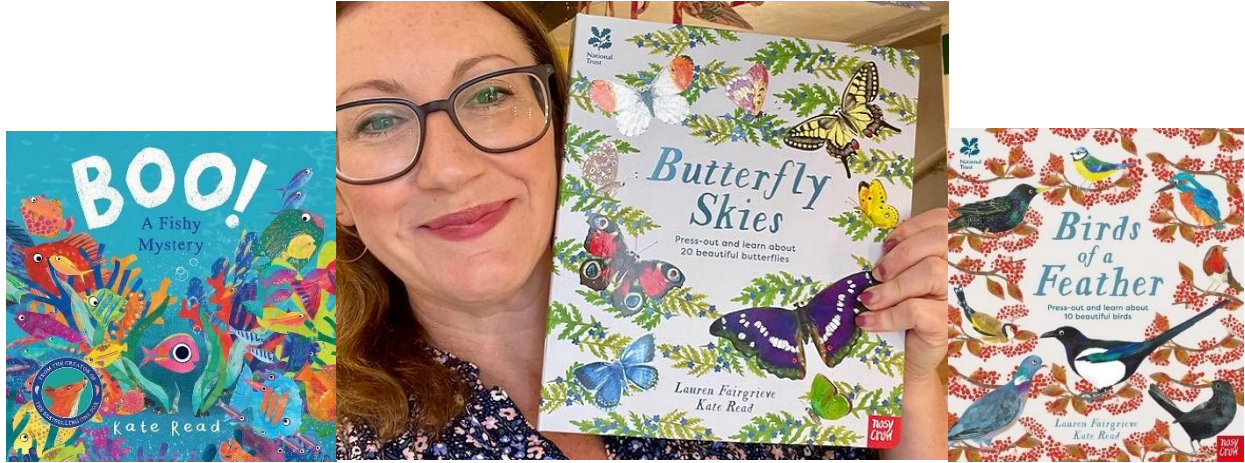
CLASS 6

Author event



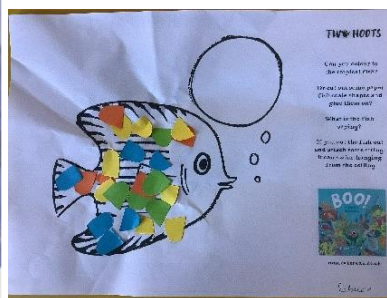
This half term the book we are exploring in English is *Birds of a Feather* by Kate Read and many classes are enjoying her book *Boo! A Fishy Mystery*.
