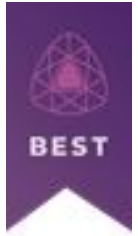


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Early Help Sources of Information and contacts 2021/22

If you have concerns, please ask to speak to the Headteacher or SEND Officer.

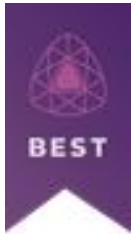
We work very closely with parents, carers and families to ensure our pupils have the support they need. The conversations we have with you will be confidential and we will always ask for your consent to share information before we contact any other organisation – unless we feel a child is at risk of immediate harm, in which case would contact the local safeguarding team.

<p>Customer First</p>	<p>This is the first point of contact with Social Care in Suffolk if you have concerns about a child or vulnerable adult.</p> <p>Call 0808 800 4005 (free from landlines and mobiles)</p> <p>Opening hours are 8am – 6:45pm Monday to Friday. Outside these hours this number will divert to the Emergency Duty Service who can deal with any matters that cannot wait until the next working day.</p>

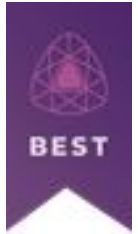

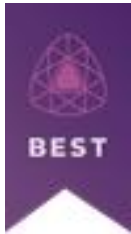


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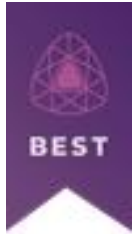

Female Genital Mutilation (FGM)	<p>The Female Genital Mutilation Act was introduced in 2003 and came into effect in March 2004. The Act makes it illegal to practice FGM in the UK, makes it illegal to take girls who are British nationals or permanent residents of the UK abroad for FGM whether or not it is lawful in that country, makes it illegal to aid, abet, counsel or procure the carrying out of FGM abroad and has a penalty of up to 14 years in prison and/or a fine. Forced Marriage and Honour-based Abuse	<p>A forced marriage is a marriage in which one or both spouses do not (or in the case of some adults with learning or physical disabilities, cannot) consent to the marriage and duress is involved. 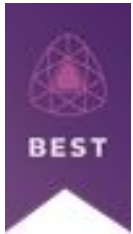


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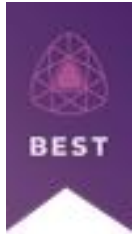

Private Fostering	Private fostering is when a child under the age of 16 (or 18 if the child has a disability) lives with someone who is not a close relative (ie not their grandparents, aunt, uncle, brother, sister, cousin, or step-parents) for 28 days or more unless that person has parental responsibility for them or is a local authority or agency foster carer. https://www.suffolksp.org.uk/parents-and-carers/private-fostering/
Prevent and Radicalisation	Prevent is the multi-agency set of arrangements aimed at preventing individuals and groups from engaging in violent extremism. Prevent is not aimed at suppressing freedom of thought and expression. Children Missing Education (CME)	A child missing from education is: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In-between the compulsory school age of 5-16

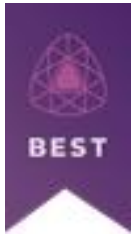


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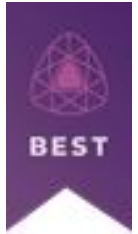
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- Not at school
- Not attending alternative education arrangements

A child may be missing from education because:

- They didn't start at a school
- They left an independent school or college
- They were excluded from school
- Their parents took them out of school
- They didn't move from school to another school, for example, moving to another local authority area
- They didn't move into the next school in their life; for example primary school to secondary school
- Their family is part of a mobile community
